COMMISSIONER DAVID A. WYANT CONFIRMED BY FLORIDA SENATE

TALLAHASSEE, FLA- Chairman Melinda N. Coonrod announced on Friday, May 5, that the Florida Senate voted to confirm Commissioner David A. Wyant for his appointment to the Florida Commission on Offender Review. "Commissioner Wyant has proven to be a great asset to the Commission this past year," said Chairman Coonrod. "I'm thrilled to have the opportunity to continue working together, supporting the Commission's mission of ensuring the safety of our citizens and state."

Commissioner Wyant began his law-enforcement career in 1994 as a patrol officer with the Bartow Police Department. He was subsequently promoted to serve as a Detective in the Special Investigations Unit where he investigated narcotic, vice, and other high profile crimes. In 2006, Commissioner Wyant was promoted to serve as the Department's Sergeant of Detectives and was appointed as the Deputy Chief in 2014, earning numerous commendations and the Polk County Police Chiefs Association Officer of the Year Award. Commissioner Wyant was appointed to the Commission by Governor Scott and the members of the Florida Cabinet on May 10, 2016, to serve a six-year term which extends until June 30, 2022.

Commissioner Wyant received a Bachelor's degree in Criminal Justice from St. Leo University in Tampa and is a graduate of the FBI National Academy in Quantico, VA.

The Florida Commission on Offender Review (FCOR), is a constitutionally authorized, quasi-judicial, decision-making body which has been serving the citizens of this state since 1941. The Commission holds offenders accountable for their behaviors and ensures public safety through its careful selection of offenders for reentry into society by administering parole, conditional medical release, control release, conditional release, and addiction recovery release supervision. The Commission also acts as the investigative arm of the Governor and Cabinet, sitting as the Board of Executive Clemency in clemency matters. The Commission's mission is to ensure public safety and provide victim assistance through the post prison release process.
